Culinary Arts & Baking/Pastry Competitions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Both the Culinary Arts and Baking & Pastry competitions will be held at Salem Hills High school on Saturday, January 28. Baking and Pastry will be in the morning, followed by Culinary Arts in the afternoon. ○ Culinary Arts & Baking/Pastry competitions are run as individual events, not teams. State competition will follow the guidelines for the national competition. ○ Each chapter is allowed two individual competitors for Culinary Arts, and one competitor for Baking and Pastry. ○ All students competing in these events at region will take an industry assessment on February 6-7. ○ All competitors must be accompanied by an adult (parent or adviser). This includes students that are 18. ○ The top two scores per region will advance to state. ○ In the case that not all regions statewide have two participants to advance, the top test scores across the state will be used to select an alternative to fill the spot to compete at state. ○ Advisers who plan to have competitors in these events should make sure to read the events overview sheet, menus, and equipment lists that was sent out by Lindsay Maxfield on December 1. This information is also on the Utah FCCLA website. ○ Baking and Pastry and Culinary Arts competitors must be registered by January 20. Regular registration doesn't close until the 27th, but due to the Midwinter Conference on Feb. 4, we have to compete early. We have to have registration for these events by the 20th. No registration for these two events will be accepted after January 20. ○ If you anticipate having competitors in either Baking & Pastry or Culinary arts, please email troy.chilcott@nebo.edu so that we can have an estimated count of participants. <p>Testing Events (Parli, Culinary Math, Baking & Pastry, and Culinary Arts)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Testing will use an online platform associated with Nationals called AnswerWrite. The testing site will be open Feb. 6-7 from 7:00 am to 10 pm. During this time frame you must have all individuals on a team schedule a time to take it the same time whether at home or in person. ○ Everyone taking the test will need a proctor. Each participant must have a proctor form (will be sent out when registration closes) ○ The testing tickets will be sent out before the testing window. It has urls for students to follow, username, and the password students will use. Please remind students and proctors that testing materials should be kept confidential during and after testing. Participants should only see test questions and are not to discuss them afterwards. If you have any other questions please let me know.
<p>How to Register</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Region Conference registration is done through the DLG Registration System. ○ This is the same registration system used for all Utah FCCLA conferences. ○ See the attached instruction sheet for a step-by-step how to register. ○ Please contact me with registration questions. ○ Please fill out registration completely, and remember to list those competing as a team together, all under the same team number. ○ If a student is competing individually, they are still registered as a 'team' but they are the only member of that team. ○ Here is the registration website: https://www.registernychapter.com/fccla/ut-r4/Main.asp
<p>Cost, Payment, & Registration Deadlines</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Registration is \$20 per person, submitted and must be postmarked by Friday, January 27 at midnight. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ EXCEPTION: Registration for Baking & Pastry and Culinary Arts must be submitted by January 20 at midnight. There will be no late registration for these two events (see note above). ○ Late registration received Jan. 28- Feb. 3 will be \$30 per person. ○ Advisers cannot make any changes to registration after February 3rd. ○ No additional students will be allowed to attend if they are not registered by the late registration deadline- February 3rd at Midnight. ○ If you pay with a credit card, there is a 4% fee added to your registration. ○ If you pay by check, please make the check out to Utah FCCLA. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Please mail all checks to: Utah FCCLA Region 4 % Jessica Knotts Maple Mountain High School 51 N Spanish Fork Parkway Spanish Fork, UT 84660
<p>Competition Levels</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Please make sure you double check the correct competition level. Students should compete on the same level they are affiliated with at Nationals. ○ Levels: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Level 1: 6-8th Grades ■ Level 2: 9-10th Grades ■ Level 3: 11-12th Grades ○ Teams with members from different levels must compete in the higher level.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Some events require participants to be affiliated as a level 3 member. To be level 3, students must have taken (or currently in) one or more of the following classes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Culinary 2, 3, or ProStart ■ ECE 1, 2, 3 ■ Textile Design ■ Entrepreneurship ■ Interior Design 2, Advanced Interior Design, Interior Design CE *Once a student is designated as level 3, they remain level 3 throughout high school.
Dress Code	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Students should follow the FCCLA dress code for the entire conference. Students will be evaluated on the following dress code. ○ Dress code: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Top: Red, black, white, or khaki button up or polo ○ Bottom: Black skirt or dress pants ○ Black Sheath dress ○ Closed toed shoes ○ No jeans, leggings, tennis shoes, flip flops, etc. ○ Advisers dress code is business casual. ○ Our students watch us, please be the example!
Lunch	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Lunch will be served at the Summit Center for all students, advisers, judges, and room consultants.
Forms	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Each student must sign and return the FCCLA Code of Conduct form as well as permission form from your district giving parent permission to attend the conference. ○ Please follow your district's travel policy for liability issues and have all forms completed before leaving school. ○ Students are not allowed to drive themselves to the conference.
Adviser Assignments	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Every school should sign up to run at least one event. This includes delegating a room consultant, and recruiting judges for the assigned event. ○ Advisers, please watch for an email with Room Consultant assignments. ○ Each judge must have a laptop or other device (not a cell phone) for judging. ○ When you have all of the judges for your event, please submit their information on the form HERE. ○ I will notify all room consultants of numbers as soon as registration is closed to get a more accurate count of how many judges are needed, but for now plan on at least 3 judges per event.
Make it to State!	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Students do not advance to state unless they have scored 50 points or higher at region. ○ Please follow the STAR Events manual carefully and completely. The STAR Event Guide is available in the FCCLA Portal. ○ The STAR Events Online Project Summary Form is now available in the FCCLA Portal under the 'surveys' tab. ○ The State Conference is March 22-23- mark your calendars!
