STAR Event Participants	Must be registered AND have projects uploaded to DLG by Friday January 27th at midnight . Late registration will be from January 28 th -Feb 1 st .
Evaluators	Evaluators will all be virtual this year. They will use DLG to evaluate projects Feb 2nd through Feb 7th at midnight. Scores will be submitted through DLG as well.
Room Consultants	Room Consultants will start checking progress of evaluators starting on Feb 6th . All events must be scored prior to room consultants filling out the summary sheet. Room Consultants have between Feb 8th through Feb 10th to finalize scores
Awards Session	The awards session will be held virtually Feb 12th at 2:00 pm . It will also be recorded if your chapter can not meet at that time.

This is the same system you have used for Fall Leadership, National Clusters, and region and state last year if you were able to attend. Registration Deadline	★ All STAR events will have to be filmed and uploaded at the time of registration.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ★ There will be LATE REGISTRATION from January 28th to February 1st. ★ No additional students will be allowed to compete if they are added after the late registration deadline February 1st 2021. ★ Remember that all students must be <u>nationally affiliated</u> in order to register and compete in Region or State.

<p>Competition Levels & Teams</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ★ Please make sure you double-check the correct level of competition. They should compete on the same level they are affiliated with at Nationals. ★ To be affiliated as a level 3 member and compete level 3 students must be or have been in one of the following classes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ★ Culinary Arts/Management ★ Early Childhood Education I & II, Early Childhood Intern ★ Textile Design ★ Entrepreneurship ★ Interior Design II ★ Advanced Interior Design ★ Once a student is affiliated as level 3, they remain level 3 in all other affiliations throughout high school. ★ Keep team members listed as the same team number. Example Team 1

<p>Dress Code</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ★ Students should follow the FCCLA dress code while recording presentations and to the awards session. Red, black, white or khaki. Advisers should be in business casual dress. (No Jeans, leggings or tennis shoes, flip flops) Show by example how to dress professional and follow the dress code. Our students watch us.

<p>STAR Events Guide</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ★ The STAR Events Guide can be found by going to fcclainc.org and logging in to your portal. Then, click on resources, then competitive events, then click on the 2020-2021 Competitive Events Guide. ★ NEW THIS YEAR: On the STAR Events Guide, be sure you and your students are following the virtual competition requirements.
<p>Baking and Pastry & Culinary</p>	<p>Nationals has made some major changes to the Culinary Arts and Baking and pastry STAR events. Both are an individual events. The selection process for Nationals will be as follows. They will select the top three students in the state and administer an industry assessment. The top 10 scores in the Nation will compete in a lab setting at National Conference. The state will implement a similar approach. A student who wish to participate at Regions will be competing an industry assessment. The top two scores per regions will move on to state. Each school is still allowed two teams, which are now individuals in each competition.</p>

<p>Advancing to State</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">★ Help your students make it to state! Students will NOT ADVANCE to state in March if they do not have a score of 50 points or higher. We are searching for more quality projects, and rewarding students for good effort.★ Please follow the STAR events manual carefully. These guidelines are there to help you and your students. If you do not have a STAR Event manual, it may be downloaded from the national website www.fcclainc.org. Look under Programs; Competitive Events; STAR events. You may download individual STAR events to print if you do not want to print the whole manual.★ There has been a change with the STAR Events Online Project Summary Form. It is now available in the National FCCLA Portal, located on the "Surveys" tab. See the email from Nikki Sue for more information!★ State Conference is on March 23rd and 24th this year, more information will come as we get closer.
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
